husbands and wives, parents and
children live in ordered harmony
according to the Word of God; for
parents who must raise children
alone; for our communities and
neighborhoods.

Th: For the Church and her pastors;
for teachers, deaconesses, and other
church workers; for missionaries and
for all who serve the Church; for
fruitful and salutary use of the
blessed Sacrament of Christ's body
and blood.

F: For the preaching of the holy cross
of our Lord Jesus Christ and for the
spread of His knowledge throughout
the whole world; for the persecuted
and oppressed; for the sick and
dying.

S: For faithfulness to the end; for the
renewal of those who are withering in
the faith or have fallen away; for
receptive hearts and minds to God's
Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors
and people as they prepare to
administer and receive Christ's holy
gifts.
